1. 4 hooks \$100.00 entry fee (from 5 classes to choose from)
2. Open to any Deere tractors that fall within the specified weight classes.
3. NO TURBBO'S OR V-8 Tractors.
4. 1961 and older
5. Competitor will throw out there worst hook and the winner will be decided by the combined distance of the other 3 hooks.
6. Each class (Modified & Open) will be 100% payback for the top 3 places.
7. These special classes will be run with the general running order for the Saturday a.m. show. Specific sign up instructions will be provided at the sign in table.
8. Modified will follow the modified/general rules listed below.
9. Open will follow the open/general rules listed below.
10. The track judges will have the final decision on all rules and regulations of the pull.

# General Rules All Three Days

1. Drivers under must be 18 years of age or older. Drivers under 18 must have a written consent of parents for each pull.
2. Obvious or excessive consumption of alcoholic beverages will be grounds for disqualification.
3. Foul or abusive language will be grounds for disqualification.
4. Drivers must be seated, with one hand on steering wheel at all times.
5. Tractors must be operated in a safe manner at all times.
6. All fans or exposed moving parts must be shielded.
7. Tractors must be weighed with driver on. If tractor is entered in more than one class, it must be weighed in each class.
8. Tractor weight may be protested. Both protesters a protested will be reweighed. Judges have the right to reweigh any tractor without protest.
9. Tractors my pull in more than one class, but only once per class.
10. Weights and parts must be securely fastened to tractor. If anything falls off tractor, it will be disqualified from the class.
11. If the track judge stops a puller for any reason, the puller will take the distance where he/she is stopped. If stopped within the first 100 feet or where cone is placed you will be entitled to one restart. No weight changes allowed.
12. Tractors shall be stopped if the front end raises to high, or higher than the judge thinks is safe.
13. During a floating finish out of bounce lines shall be continued to the end of track at judge's decision.
14. The track judges will have the final decision on all rules and regulations of the pull.
15. Anytime any part of tractor or skid goes outside boundaries it will be disqualified.
16. Rolling the dice is required to select line up positions in each class.
17. As of the 2024 pulling season. The hitch point or clevis needs to be 3 inches wide by 3 ¾ inch from front to back.

# Saturday Modified Antique

## 4 mph speed

1961 and older  
20 inch drawbar height

Speed determined by speed board with a grace period before the cone placed at 100 feet.

1. No 18.4 – tires below five thousand pound class.
2. No turbo or forced induction. No sort of power boosters allowed.  
2A. No fuel injection allowed on gas tractors.
3. Front weight not to exceed 11 feet of center line of rear axle.
4. No hitch point adjuster above center line of rear axle.
5. 20 inch drawbar height with hitches no closer than 18 inches to center of the rear axle. With a fixed hitch from all directions. No floating hitches.
6. RPM allowed 20% over.
7. Mandatory wheelie bars and highly recommended kill switches.
8. Tractors will be equipped with wheelie bars. No more than 10” above the ground and no less than 20” from the outside of the pass across. Must have pad that are a minimum of 5 square inches and has to support the weight of the tractor.
9. Top cut tires allowed no full cuts.
10. As of the 2024 pulling season. The hitch point or clevis needs to be 3 inches wide by 3 ¾ inch from front to back.

**General rules apply to all pullers and track judges will have the final decision.**

# Saturday Open Antique

## Open Speed

1961 and older  
20 inch drawbar height

1. Any cut tires allowed (18.4 max tire width).
2. 20 inch draw bar height with hitches no closer than 18 inches to center of the rear axle. With a fixed hitch from all directions. No floating hitches.
3. RPM not to exceed 3000.
4. No hitch point adjuster above center line of rear axle.
5. Front weight not to exceed 11 feet of center line of rear axle.
6. Mandatory wheelie bars and kill switches.
7. No turbo or forced induction. No sort of power boosters allowed.
8. Tractors will be equipped with wheelie bars. No more than 10" above the ground and no less than 20" from the outside of the pass across. Must have pad that are a minimum of 5 square inches and has to support the weight of the tractor.
9. As of the 2024 pulling season. The hitch point or clevis needs to be 3 inches wide by 3 ¾ inch from front to back.

**General rules apply to all pullers and track judges will have the final decision.**
